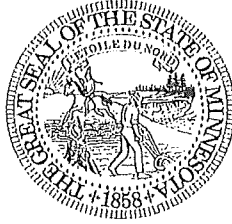

As a senior leader I take strategic direction and develop implementation strategies with leaders that I oversee. Since joining our EMS division has double in size in number of employees. I've directly lead the acquisition of 4-ambulance agencies and implementation strategy. I have been a key contributor to our strong fiscal performance which has increased by over 100% since 2008. Consulting with other EMS agencies from areas of finance to operations is an area I lead at EMS. I work with a tremendously talented group of leaders and honored to coach such a high performing team.

As a Board member responsibilities include representing constituents concerns and helping the agency set overarching public policy planning and proposed statute writing.

Other duties included budget planning, grant writing, EMS education, guideline development, quality assurance/quality management implementation, entertainment coordination, and recruitment.
