I have the honor to announce that the House has adopted the recommendation and report of the Conference Committee on Senate File No. 2849, and repassed said bill in accordance with the report of the Committee, so adopted.

S.F. No. 2849: A bill for an act relating to education; appropriating money for education and related purposes to the higher education services office, the board of trustees of the Minnesota state colleges and universities, and the board of regents of the University of Minnesota; amending Laws 1994, chapter 643, section 69, subdivision 1.

Senate File No. 2849 is herewith returned to the Senate.

H.F. No. 2493: A bill for an act relating to retirement; modifying provisions of various local pension plans; making miscellaneous benefit and administrative changes; amending Minnesota Statutes 1994, sections 353B.11, subdivisions 1 and 3; and 353B.13; Laws 1965, chapter 519,

section 1, as amended; Laws 1992, chapter 563, section 5; Laws 1994, chapter 490, section 2; and Laws 1995, chapter 262, article 7, section 1.

The House respectfully requests that a Conference Committee of 3 members be appointed thereon.

Kahn, Jefferson and Rhodes have been appointed as such committee on the part of the House.

House File No. 2493 is herewith transmitted to the Senate with the request that the Senate appoint a like committee.

INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING OF SENATE BILLS

The following bills were read the first time and referred to the committees indicated.

S.F. No. 2882: A bill for an act relating to appointments of individuals to public positions; prohibiting the sale or transfer of public appointments to other individuals or entities; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 15.

Referred to the Committee on Governmental Operations and Veterans.

Messrs. Merriam, Morse, Laidig, Frederickson and Lessard introduced--

S.F. No. 2883: A bill for an act proposing an amendment to the Minnesota Constitution, article XI, section 14; extending until the year 2025 the period during which not less than 40 percent of the net proceeds from the state lottery must be credited to the environment and natural resources trust funds.

Referred to the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources.
