#### MOTIONS AND RESOLUTIONS - CONTINUED

#### SUSPENSION OF RULES

Senator Hottinger moved that an urgency be declared within the meaning of Article IV, Section 19, of the Constitution of Minnesota, with respect to S.F. No. 1511 and that the rules of the Senate be so far suspended as to give S.F. No. 1511 its second and third reading and place it on its final passage. The motion prevailed.

S.F. No. 1511 was read the second time.

Senator Pappas moved to amend S.F. No. 1511 as follows:

Page 2, delete line 7, and insert:

"General

\$1,354,748,000 \$1,344,724,000 \$2,699,472,000"

Page 3, after line 54, insert:

"The base appropriation for MnLINK operations is \$400,000 each year beginning in fiscal year 2006."

Page 8, line 22, after the period, insert "This is a onetime transfer."

Page 14, delete section 13

Renumber the sections in sequence and correct the internal references

Amend the title accordingly

The motion prevailed. So the amendment was adopted.

Senator Pappas then moved to amend S.F. No. 1511 as follows:

Page 8, delete lines 16 to 22 and insert:

"Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, by June 30, 2003, the commissioner of finance shall transfer \$30,000,000 of uncommitted balances in the SELF loan reserve fund, under Minnesota Statutes, section 136A.1701, to the budget reserve account in the general fund. By June 30,

2007, the commissioner of finance shall return this amount to the SELF loan reserve fund. The amount necessary to make the return transfer is appropriated from the general fund to the commissioner of finance for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2007."

The motion prevailed. So the amendment was adopted.

Senator Kleis moved to amend S.F. No. 1511 as follows:

Page 14, after line 29, insert:

"Sec. 15. [LIMITS ON TUITION INCREASES.]

Public institutions of higher education shall limit the impact of budget reductions on students. To that end, the board of trustees of the Minnesota state colleges and universities shall limit tuition increases to a maximum of nine percent each year. The board of regents at the University of Minnesota is also encouraged to limit tuition increases to a maximum of nine percent each year."

Renumber the sections in sequence and correct the internal references

Amend the title accordingly

Senator Neuville moved to amend the Kleis amendment to S.F. No. 1511 as follows:

Page 1, after line 10, insert:

"Sec. 16. [FREEZE ON SALARIES AND BENEFITS.]

The board of trustees of the Minnesota state colleges and universities shall freeze salaries and benefits in the aggregate for its employees at 2003 levels. The board of regents of the University of Minnesota is encouraged to freeze salaries and benefits in the aggregate for its employees at 2003 levels."

Page 9, after line 26, insert:

"Sec. 3. [135A.157] [PENALTIES FOR RIOTING.]

If a student enrolled in a postsecondary institution is convicted of damage to property or violence to persons in connection with a riot, the student is not eligible for a state grant award under section 136A.121 after conviction and must pay the highest applicable tuition rate, including the nonresident tuition rate, to attend a public postsecondary institution in any subsequent enrollment periods. For the purpose of this section, "riot" means a first, second, or third degree riot as defined in section 609.71.

## **[EFFECTIVE DATE.]** This section is effective the day following final enactment."

Amend the title accordingly
