FIRST READING OF HOUSE BILLS

The following bills were read the first time and referred as indicated.

H.F. No. 722: A bill for an act relating to traffic regulations; exempting garbage trucks and

recycling vehicles from certain weight restrictions; amending Minnesota Statutes 2002, section 169.87, subdivision 6.

H.F. No. 2085: A bill for an act relating to health; providing for review of hospital moratorium exceptions; appropriating money; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 144.

Referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration for comparison with S.F. No. 1835, now on General Orders.

H.F. No. 2101: A bill for an act relating to state government; providing for local government impact notes; providing that certain rules take effect only upon legislative approval; appropriating money; amending Minnesota Statutes 2002, section 14.19; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 14.

Referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration for comparison with S.F. No. 2895.

Pursuant to Rule 45, the Committee on Rules and Administration recommends that H.F. No. 2386 be amended as follows:

Delete all the language after the enacting clause of H.F. No. 2386 and insert the language after the enacting clause of S.F. No. 2350, the second engrossment; further, delete the title of H.F. No. 2386 and insert the title of S.F. No. 2350, the second engrossment.

And when so amended H.F. No. 2386 will be identical to S.F. No. 2350, and further recommends that H.F. No. 2386 be given its second reading and substituted for S.F. No. 2350, and that the Senate File be indefinitely postponed.
