FIRST READING OF HOUSE BILLS

The following bill was read the first time.

H.F. No. 1981: A bill for an act relating to health; extending the expiration date for the Maternal and Child Health Advisory Task Force; amending Minnesota Statutes 2006, section 145.881, subdivision 1.

S.F. No. 2199: A bill for an act relating to energy; regulating the storage of nuclear waste at nuclear generating plants; amending Minnesota Statutes 2006, section 116C.779, subdivision 1; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 216B.

Reports the same back with the recommendation that the bill be amended as follows:

Page 2, line 7, before "facility" insert "discontinued"

Page 2, line 8, delete the new language and insert "the discontinued Prairie Island facility and \$5,250,000 for the discontinued Monticello facility"

Page 2, delete section 2 and insert:

"Sec. 2. [216B.1637] RECOVERY OF CERTAIN LIMITED UTILITY GREENHOUSE GAS INFRASTRUCTURE COSTS.

A public utility that owns a nuclear power plant and a public utility furnishing gas service may file for recovery of investments and expenses associated with the replacement of cast iron natural gas distribution and service lines owned by the utility and to replace breakers that contain sodium hexafluoride in order to reduce the risk of greenhouse gases being released into the atmosphere. Upon a finding that the projects are consistent with the public interest and do not impose excessive costs on customers, the commission shall provide timely recovery of the utility's investment and expenses on any approved projects through a rate adjustment mechanism similar to that provided for transmission projects under section 216B.16, subdivision 7, paragraphs (b) to (d)."

And when so amended the bill do pass.
