1. PARLIAMENTARY REFERENCE

The rules of parliamentary practice contained in Mason's Manual of Legislative Procedure (1989 edition) govern the Senate in all cases in which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with these rules and orders of the Senate and the joint rules and orders of the Senate and House of Representatives.

- 7.3 The omnibus tax and appropriation bills are:
- (1) the omnibus tax bill;
- (2) the E-12 education appropriations bill;
- (3) the higher education appropriations bill;
- (4) the health and human services appropriations bill;
- (5) the environment, energy, and natural resources appropriations bill;
- (6) the agriculture and veterans rural economies appropriations bill;
- (7) the economic development and housing jobs and economic growth appropriations bill;
- (8) the commerce and consumer protection appropriations bill;
- (9) the energy, utilities and telecommunications appropriations bill;
- (10) the judiciary and public safety appropriations bill;
- (9) the judiciary appropriations bill;
- (10) (11) the state government innovation and veterans appropriations bill;

(11) (12) the transportation appropriations bill; and

(12) (13) the omnibus capital investment bill.

An omnibus appropriation or tax bill may not be divided.

Madam President:
