St. Paul, Minnesota, Tuesday, January 8, 2013

This being the day designated by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Minnesota for the assembling of the Legislature, the Senators-elect met in the Senate Chamber of the Capitol and were called to order at 12 o'clock noon by the Lieutenant Governor, Yvonne Prettner Solon.

Prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Rev. Dennis Morreim.

The Lieutenant Governor and the Senators gave the pledge of allegiance to the flag of the United States of America.

The Lieutenant Governor appointed Richard J. Cohen as Clerk Pro Tem.

A bill may not be introduced on the first day.

- (6) ~~the agriculture and rural economies~~ appropriations bill;
- (7) ~~the jobs and economic growth~~ appropriations bill;
- (8) ~~the commerce and consumer protection~~ appropriations bill;
- (9) ~~the energy, utilities and telecommunications~~ appropriations bill;

- (10) (6) the judiciary and ~~public safety~~ appropriations bill;
- (11) (7) the state ~~government innovation~~ departments and veterans appropriations bill;
- (12) (8) the transportation and public safety appropriations bill; and
- (13) (9) the omnibus capital investment bill.

An omnibus appropriation or tax bill may not be divided.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Senate of the State of Minnesota:

For the 2013 session of the 88th Legislature, the Secretary of the Senate may purchase postage to furnish each member of the Senate 2,750 stamps. Upon receipt of a written request justifying the need, the Chair of the Committee on Rules and Administration, after consultation with the Senate Minority Leader, may authorize postage to furnish a member up to 2,000 additional stamps. Each member named as chair of a standing committee in the Senate resolution designating committee assignments may be furnished with an additional 1,000 stamps for the necessary business of the committee.

An additional postage allowance of 1,000 stamps is authorized for the Senate Minority Leader; one other member of the minority designated by the Senate Minority Leader; and one member of the majority designated by the Senate Majority Leader.

Each member of the Senate shall receipt to the Secretary of the Senate for the postage received.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Senate of the State of Minnesota, the House of Representatives concurring:

The Commissioner of Administration shall reserve all parking space necessary on the Capitol grounds, Capitol Approach, and Aurora Avenue, in the State Office Building ramp, and elsewhere in the capitol area for the use of the members and staff of the Legislature for the 88th session of the Legislature, allowing reasonable space for parking to the general public having business at the

Capitol. The Committee on Rules and Administration of the Senate and the Committee on Rules and Legislative Administration of the House of Representatives may designate necessary personnel to work with the Commissioner of Administration in this matter.

The Secretary of the Senate and the Controller of the House of Representatives may deduct from the check of any legislator or legislative employee in each year of the 88th session of the Legislature a sum adequate to cover the exercise of the parking privilege defined in this resolution in conformity with the practice of the Commissioner of Administration.

Senate Resolution No. 6: A Senate resolution relating to the attendance of members of standing committees at meetings and seminars held within this state; providing for the payment of expenses.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Senate of the State of Minnesota:

For the 2013 session of the 88th Legislature, members of a standing committee or subcommittee of the Senate, and employees thereof, upon approval of the Committee on Rules and Administration or its chair, may be reimbursed as provided in this resolution for attendance at meetings and seminars held within this state, including but not limited to meetings of the National Conference of State Legislatures and the Council of State Governments and their committees, on subjects within the jurisdiction of the standing committee or subcommittee.

Expenses incurred in attending these meetings and seminars must be paid by the Secretary of the Senate with warrants drawn on the Senate legislative expense fund.
