Page 1, delete section 1 and insert:

"Section 1. DISASTER CONTINGENCY ACCOUNT; APPROPRIATION.

\$9,635,000 is appropriated in fiscal year 2015 from the general fund to the commissioner of public safety for transfer to the disaster contingency account under Minnesota Statutes, section 12.221, subdivision 6. This is a onetime appropriation."

Page 2, line 3, after "roads" insert "and bridges"

Amend the title accordingly

The motion prevailed. So the amendment was adopted.
