the title of H.F. No. 2360, the second engrossment; and insert the title of S.F. No. 2269, the first engrossment.

And when so amended H.F. No. 2360 will be identical to S.F. No. 2269, and further recommends that H.F. No. 2360 be given its second reading and substituted for S.F. No. 2269, and that the Senate File be indefinitely postponed.
